## "Forsaking the Assembling"

We are "church planting missionaries." Church planting means our goal is NOT to just report numbers to you, seeing souls saved by *addition*, but that we want to do it the New Testament way, through church planting, seeing souls saved by *multiplication*. For that to happen, we need our people to *come to church*.

If all of "our people" came the same day to the same service, I am pretty sure our building could not handle the large number of people.... BUT, our problem is that our people tend to "forsake the assembling" of themselves together. For the sake of your praying for us about this matter, I will share my opinion as to why this is.

One, we don't live in a country that has church culture. That is, it is not



nor has ever been the habit of Thai people to "go to church," as it is or at least had been in America. So the result is that many Thai Christians view church assembly as something you do if you are free, can do at your convenience, or you go when you have trouble in your life.

Two, many of our people are just plain spiritually immature. (Please continue reading on the back...)

I guess those percentages probably aren't much better than the States, but it sure isn't a good formula for a solid church plant. We have a very large number of people who still need to become actual dis-



ciples of Christ. Please pray with us to this end, that the Christians we have would grow to spiritual maturity and bear fruit; that God would give us wisdom to teach and lead them in this way; and that many more would come to know Jesus Christ as their own savior this coming year.
